Message from the Conference



HAPPY NEW YEAR! We have all together entered the year of 2021, and said goodbye to 2020! One of my favorite activities is to read, whatever year it is, and one of my favorite authors is Kathleen Norris. The book of hers I am reading now is "Acedia and Me-A Marriage, Monks, and a Writer's Life."

If you are not familiar with her, Norris is a mainline Protestant who has spent much time in Catholic monastic communities. She writes that acedia is a key term in monastic history and medieval literature, and according to one medical dictionary, is "a mental syndrome, the chief features of which are listlessness, carelessness, apathy and melancholia." Acedia was what those in the monastic life had to battles against constantly, and she notes that Acedia is very common is our world today as well. Her words in this 2008 book seem so eerily accurate to what many of us are dealing with in our current Pandemic world.

The great temptation that Acedia dangles before us is this according to Norris: "Whatever the place of our commitment-a monastic cell, a faith community, a job, a marriage-acedia says we are better off walking away." Have you thought at some point during this Pandemic about just walking away from something? I know that you may not have told anyone else your thoughts, but I have a feeling that you have had them, because we all have.

Norris then writes that "the monastic perspective can assist us specifically with regard to understanding the value of community. Imagine for a moment that the people you encounter at home, work, or school are the very people God has given you to pray with, eat with, and play with for the rest of your life. And you are supposed to thank God for this, every day, several times a day. This is what monastic people take on... How radical to think we can best know ourselves by embracing commitment, not rejecting it; by relating to others, not callously relegating them to the devilishly convenient category of 'other'". May you and I be as good and gentle with ourselves as we can be, so that we can keep the commitments we have made to the community, to the glory of God.

Year-End Planning: Time to Update Your Church Membership Records!

This week is a reminder to update your church membership lists. UCC Yearbook reporting is scheduled to open January 8, 2021, and it is important that your church report current and accurate membership information. For churches that are affiliated with more than one denomination, the membership number should only reflect members who identify themselves as UCC.

The membership number is used to determine the amount of dues that your church gives to your association and the Vermont Conference.

The numbers you report also help determine how many delegates the Vermont Conference can designate for General Synod, which is one of the essential ways your voice is heard on important issues.

Your church number includes the Vermont Conference number which is 82. Therefore, your complete church number (including zeroes) is 82xxxx
