Message from the Conference

Dear Beloved Community in the Vermont Conference,

This morning as I read the news of the day I saw an article about the dramatic rise in the murders of black and brown girls and women. One woman who commented on the article simply said, no one cares about these victims because they are not white.

A short time later, I read a quote from Robert P. Jones who said, "In public opinion polls a clear pattern has emerged:white Christians are consistently more likely than whites who are religiously unaffiliated to deny the existence of structural racism." (White Too Long: The Legacy of White Supremacy in American Christianity).

Why should we engage with systemic racism in our Conference and congregations? Because the need for change is so great and the price of racism continues to be the dead bodies of our black, brown and indigenous sisters and brothers. We engage racism to take off the blinders of white privilege and to live in to the gospel mandate to love our neighbors as we love ourselves.

For the past few weeks a small group has been working on ideas to help us all be more aware and able to take steps to combat systemic racism in our congregations and Conference. A first step was to design a survey to get a better picture of work that is already being done as well as areas where more resources and information are needed. You will find the survey in this EKIT. Please take the time to fill it out and return it. This will help us all gain insight into what our congregations are already doing, where there are barriers and what resources are needed to continue our work combatting systemic racism. Once the survey results are collated, we will use the information to inform our next steps in seeking racial justice.



The 2021 Information Review is now available for your updates. The information review is a part of the covenantal responsibilities for all authorized clergy in the United Church of Christ and updating it helps the Conference and associations keep in contact with you and your ministerial needs.

There are two ways to provide this information to the conference.

If your standing is held in the Grafton-Orange Association, we will update your information in the data base and then send your form to your own Committee on Ministry.

The new Vermont Conference directory will be prepared based upon the information you provide. It is important that the office have accurate information for all our ministers. This form includes questions covering two years: 2020-2021. We ask that all of you complete the form and return it to the office no later than **December 15.**

You will note that there is a question about Boundary Awareness training. Attending regular boundary training every 3 years is a covenantal expectation. If you have not sent your latest and most up to date certificate for boundary training to the office please send that to Jackie. Be Aware of Scams and Email Phishing!

There are many different scams currently circulating whether via email, text message, or phone call. Here are some of the best tricks (courtesy of Yahoo.com) to make sure you are not scammed!

- Hang up immediately if you hear a recording when you answer the phone.
- Avoid picking up calls from unknown numbers, even if they appear to be local. (This can be applied to
 emails, as well. Make sure you check the return address to make sure matches the contact information
 you have even if it appears the sender is a pal, family member, coworker, etc.)
- Reporting spam text messages can help cut down on another major technological annoyance.
