Message from the Conference

February is Black History Month, and there are so many good ways that we as church leaders can be proactively Anti Racist during this month. I think that many of us often highlight stories about Rosa Parks and MLK and the Freedom Struggle during this month, but recently I was reading an article by James Ross, the Minister for Diversity, Equality and Inclusion for the Southern New England Conference and he has some other ideas for you to consider as well.

- 1.Look at your own community, and elevate stories about black people or organizations.
- 2. Share stories about black joy and celebration-not just about the trauma of black history.
- 3. Remember that black history did not begin with slavery-check out and share stories of black life before the Middle Passage.
- 4. Black history did not end in the 1960's. What stories can you share about black people from the last decade, last year or last week?
- 5. What black folks made major contributions to the development of our Christian faith? To the history of the United Church of Christ? Share their stories!

At our Conference clergy conversation this week, Josh Simon of the Essex Junction church shared that his church is raising awareness of the bill that will be coming before Vermont voters that would eliminate the reference to slavery in the Vermont Constitution. Vermont was the first place in the world to outlaw slavery, but the section in the Constitution is somewhat ambiguous. This is a great topic to educate the members of your congregation about as well!

Time to Update Your Church Membership Records!

This week is a reminder to update your church membership lists. UCC Yearbook reporting is scheduled to open January 5, 2022, and it is important that your church report current and accurate membership information. For churches that are affiliated with more than one denomination, the membership number should only reflect members who identify themselves as UCC.

The membership number is used to determine the amount of dues that your church gives to your association and the Vermont Conference. The numbers you report also help determine how many delegates the Vermont Conference can designate for General Synod, which is one of the essential ways your voice is heard on important issues. Your church number includes the Vermont Conference number which is 82. Therefore, your complete church number (including zeroes) is 82xxxx.







Pastoral Relations Committees




