I am glad to report that your Hope Fund Fundraising Team is hard at work! As many of you know, we as a Conference voted in November to establish this Team to bring the Hope Fund into reality, and Kevin Goldenbogen, Leigh McCaffrey, Elissa Johnk, chair Andy Nagy-Benson and myself have been laying out our plans to invite the clergy, lay people, churches and Associations of our Conference to give to our future together.

Time to Update Your Church Membership Records!
This week is a reminder to update your church membership lists. UCC Yearbook reporting is scheduled to open January 5, 2022, and it is important that your church report current and accurate membership information. For churches that are affiliated with more than one denomination, the membership number should *only reflect members who identify themselves as UCC*.



There are also *FABULOUS PRIZES* this year!!

"This year we are offering several incentives for churches that submit both their annual Yearbook report and answer the supplemental research questions. Every church that responds to both will be entered into a random drawing for several prizes. The following prizes will be awarded:

- \$100 UCC Resources Gift Card – 5 gift cards will be awarded
- One year free subscription to Access UCC (online Yearbook and Directory) – 10 subscriptions will be awarded

Why do we do this?

The membership number is used to determine the amount of dues that your church gives to your association and the Vermont Conference. The numbers you report also help determine how many delegates the Vermont Conference can designate for General Synod, which is one of the essential ways your voice is heard on important issues. Your church number includes the Vermont Conference number which is 82. Therefore, your complete church number (including zeroes) is 82xxxx.

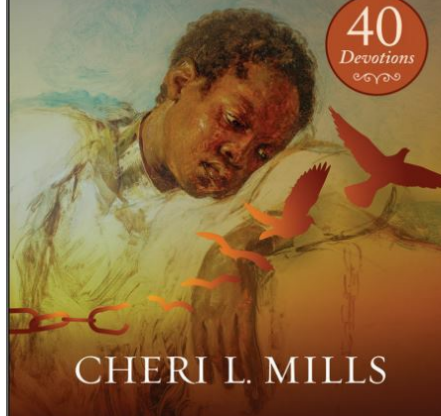

Lenten Resources with an Environmental and Indigenous/Racial Justice Focus

I recently received notice of this intriguing looking set of resources for Lent from Janet Parker, a UCC Pastor from Oregon who has been working with Indigenous theologian and writer Randy Woodley and his Eloheh Indigenous Center for Earth Justice in Yamhill, OR. She describes these two resources as follows.

"The focus of this partnership right now is encouraging people to read and discuss his newest book, ***Becoming Rooted: One Hundred Days of Reconnecting with Sacred Earth***. It's a wonderful set of reflections that invite us to adopt a more Indigenous worldview and reconnect with the land and creatures around us. If you are interested in Randy's book, which some faith communities around Oregon are reading in the 100 days leading up to Earth Day, you can learn more about that and the whole EcoFaith/Eloheh project [here](#).

In addition, seven pastor/writers have put together a quite unusual Lenten devotional called, ***A Grounded Faith: Reconnecting with Creator and Creation in the Season of Lent***. It was written to be used as a companion resource to *Becoming Rooted* by Christians during Lent, but it CAN be used as a standalone resource. *It's unusual because it addresses white supremacy, destruction of Native American peoples, and ecological devastation head on, with attention to the classic themes of Lent AND an invitation to world-and-earth-healing practices*. And it's a great way to expose them to Randy's ideas and the beautiful Indigenous values and insights in his book even if they don't read it.

You can download a free preview of this book [here](#), and you can purchase the whole thing in downloadable electronic form for just \$3 from **Barclay Press**. Many churches are ordering the \$3 books to distribute to their congregations. The **print copy** costs \$12 for one but just \$9.00 if you order 10 or more. 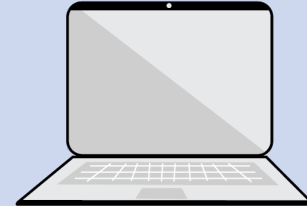
Basic Boundary Training to be Offered on March 26th

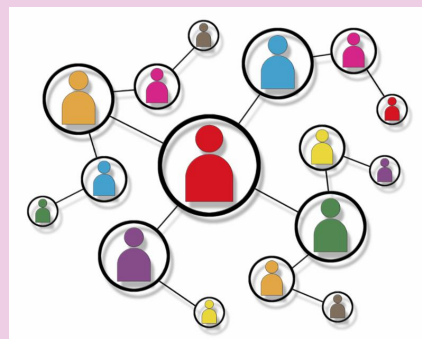

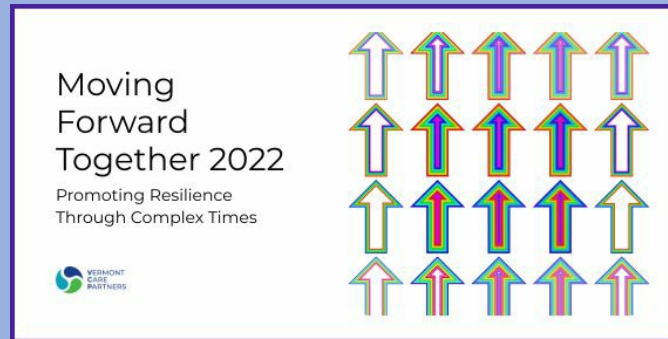
Revs. Tara Barber and Stephen Boyd will share best practices from around the church and be prepared to answer your questions.
