Message from the Conference

Friends of the Vermont Conference,

I wanted you to know about an upcoming Vitality Event in our Conference! On Saturday, March 11th from 10-3, the Rev. Dr. Patty Kogut will be coming to lead a seminar on "How to be a Vital Church in a Post-Pandemic Age." Patty is an Associate Conference Minister in the Southern New England Conference, and she also led a vital church for decades. I have known her for many years, and know that she has much to bring to us

The vitality event will be held at the First Congregational Church UCC in Springfield. Those of you who came to the one 3 years ago know what a great space they have! They are providing a delicious lunch for us. We encourage churches to bring teams of at least one pastor and three lay people, since research shows that an event like this has a greater impact if there is a team from a local church rather than just one individual. There will also be a hybrid option, and if you are doing that, we also encourage you to have a team of at least one pastor and three lay people watching together.

The cost will be \$75 per church for those in person, which includes lunch, and \$50 per church for those doing it by hybrid. Those churches coming in person can bring as many people as you want for the \$75 fee. Scholarships are available for those churches that need them-just be in touch with me. Registration will begin on Feb. 1st on both the Conference website and on Ekit.








Congratulations to Bristol Federated Church!



Our workshops this year are so abundant they will happen TWICE. Stay tuned for more information!




Our keynote speaker is Bill McKibben (pictured here) whos new book "The Flag, the Cross, and the Station Wagon" was just released.




