Message from the Conference

When was the last time you or your church went on a spiritual retreat? I was reminded of their importance recently when one of our clergy told me about their desire to do a spiritual retreat this year. Spiritual retreats have a long and powerful history in the Christian tradition. So many of our forebears in the early church went on spiritual retreat that many of them ended up living out in the desert fulltime-a sort of permanent spiritual retreat!

Many of us perhaps are not quite ready for that! But when was the last time your church had a leadership or all church retreat? Or when was the last time you personally chose to go on retreat? In our fast paced world, it is easy to lose sight of our real priorities day to day. It is also easy to not stop and take the time to listen to God as we check off the "to-do's" on our daily schedule. And yet the Bible makes it clear over and over again that God most often speaks into our lives when we are willing to stop and listen, when we will take a break from our daily schedule to retreat. We see that over and over again with Jesus, that He took time out of a very busy schedule to get away to pray and think, sometimes by Himself, and sometimes with others.

So as you map out what you and your church are going to be doing in 2023, I hope you might fit in time for a retreat there. If you need suggestions of places for a larger group of people to go, I do have a couple. You could also just contact a neighboring church and see if you could use their space. If it is an individual retreat, there may be a monastery or other spiritual community that you could join for a day or two. But I encourage you to be intentional about planning this time, so that you and your ministry will continue to be open to our Still Speaking God.

"Northfield Needs a New Chief of Police"

January 12th, 2023

A Joint Statement by Northfield Middle High School's Gender & Sexuality Alliance; the United Church of Northfield; Outright Vermont; Rights & Democracy of Vermont; Education Justice Coalition of Vermont; Vermont Student Anti-Racism Network; Vermont Conference of the United Church of Christ; TeachOut Vermont; Concerned Parents, Educators, and Students of Northfield

Northfield's current chief of police has revealed himself (1) to have a feeble grasp on what the laws and constitution actually mean and (2) to be willing to misinterpret and misapply the laws in order to advance his own ideological agenda.

In 2020, the district attorney of Washington County issued a Brady letter, which called into question Chief John Helfant's ability to faithfully execute his duties. An investigation revealed evidence of Fourth Amendment violations and potential on-duty racist practices, including disparately worse treatment of Hispanic and African American men. It was also revealed that Officer Helfant omitted exculpatory evidence from his statements and failed to activate his body camera when this disparate treatment is alleged to have occurred. Although criminal charges were not brought against him at the time, he nonetheless has become a less effective officer because his standing in the community was eroded and the DA's office no longer accepts his referrals of non-listed and non-violent crimes."

COURAGEOUS CONVERSATIONS on Christian Nationalism



"Jesus Christ, we invoke your name!"

"Thank you for allowing the United States of America to be reborn....In Christ's holy name we pray. Amen!"

Two years ago, as throngs of supporters of former President Trump stormed the Capitol to disrupt the peaceful transition of power from one administration to the next, several made their way into the Senate chamber where the sentiments above were expressed.

Nearby, rioters in the Rotunda, overcome with emotion, erupted into chorus beneath the Apotheosis of Washington, belting out the refrain of the Battle Hymn of the Republic, followed by an impromptu prayer: "Thank you for letting us stand up for our country. Guide us so that we may do your will." From icons to prayers to rituals—such expressions permeated every facet of the events of Jan. 6, 2021, from start to aftermath.

While it's been clear all along that most of the rioters were Christian and expressed their motivations accordingly, coverage and analysis of the incident has largely focused on the cultural and political commitments of the rioters; not nearly as much attention is given to the theological and spiritual frameworks motivating so many of the rioters—both on and beyond that fateful day. (One singular exception to this has been the insightful work of the Uncivil Religion project, a joint effort of University of Alabama's Department of Religious Studies and the Smithsonian's National Museum of American History.)

Yet we cannot fully understand the events of January 6 apart from these motivations. Which is why on January 31, at 7pm, Newfane Church will host a public conversation on Christian nationalism. For this conversation, we're thrilled to be joined by Dr. Erica M. Ramirez, Director of the Center for the Study of Theological Expression at Auburn Theological Seminary. Dr. Ramirez's research explores how reactionary forms of religion, especially within Christianity, both support and undermine democratic flourishing. She holds her PhD in sociology of religion from Drew University and was recently named one of "15 up-and-coming faith influencers" by the Religion News Service.

This will be the first in a series of monthly discussions we're launching called Courageous Conversations. Through these conversations we seek to create a regular space in which to engage folks in our area on a range of pertinent questions facing our country and community. Each month we'll tackle a different topic in the hope of creating opportunities to face hard, uncomfortable, high-stakes questions, together, in healthy, generative ways that stoke our curiosity, illumine our perspectives, and make space for real difference.















Congratulations to Bristol Federated Church!






