The Vermont Conferences 228th Annual Meeting will be connecting the dots between creation justice, economic justice, environmental justice, and LGBTQ justice.

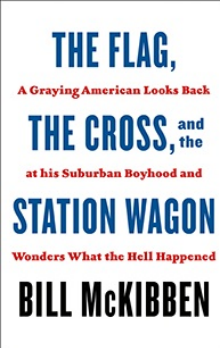
Our workshops this year are so abundant they will happen TWICE. Stay tuned for more information!

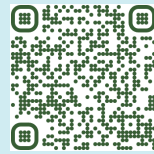

# ON THE MORALITY OF ABORTION

OUR CONVERSATION PARTNER:

**ELIZABETH FREESE, PH.D**

There's no question where most Americans stand on the legal right to abortion: According to recent Public Religion Research Institute [findings](#), nearly two-thirds

(64%) of Americans say abortion should be legal in most or all circumstances. In November a staggering 77% of Vermonters **supported** a constitutional amendment affirming “personal reproductive autonomy,” adding further protection for abortion rights within our borders.

Yet beneath this decisive show of support lurks a less visible moral reticence. While most Americans consistently support making abortion legal in most or all cases, data also show a persistent ambivalence toward the procedure. According to Pew Research findings, 46% of Americans figure abortion to be morally wrong in most or all cases, with only 31% saying it’s morally acceptable. Nearly half (48%) of Americans believe there are situations in which it is morally wrong but should still be legal.

Herein may lie the cause of our inability to break through the cultural impasse on the issue of abortion. As Dr. Elizabeth Freese observes, “We’ve been hopelessly muddled in this ambivalent ‘morality gap’ between legality and cultural acceptability, resulting in a conflicting patchwork of legislation and endless, exhausting, existential anxiety-provoking fights.” We agree, and on Tuesday, March 28, we’re hosting a conversation focused squarely on the morality of abortion.

We are so fortunate to have as our conversation partner for the evening Dr. Freese herself. Dr. Freese is a scholar-activist serving as a Scholar-in-Residence with SACReD (Spiritual Alliance of Communities for Reproductive Dignity) to support its curriculum program. She previously co-developed and managed production of courses for the online Learning Center at the Religious Coalition for Reproductive Choice and developed abortion access advocacy resources for Christians through Auburn Seminary. She is Adjunct Professor of Religion and Society at Drew University Theological School, where she earned her PhD in Religion and Society.

Discussions on abortion often encompass an unwieldy breadth of considerations. Ours will focus on the theological, scriptural, traditional, and other sources of moral guidance. We are not asking, should abortion be legal? We are asking, is it *right*?



The Guilford Community Park “will feature a 48’x24’ timber-frame pavilion in the old Vermont style, a classic seven circuit labyrinth, a playground for young children, open areas for kicking a ball or throwing a Frisbee, and a campfire pit for singing songs and telling stories. The park will serve as a platform for music and cultural events, a public space for having a picnic or getting away from it all for meditation and relaxation.”(GCC, Hope Fund application)

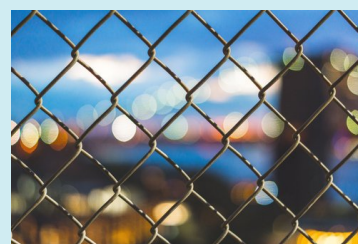

## Financial Seminars in West Dover!

If your church is anything like ours, you probably have a good number of folks over 55 which in some circles qualifies them as

“seniors”. After hearing some scary stories of friends who experienced a loss of their spouse and had little or no knowledge about their finances, the **Loose Knit Group (LKG)** of the West Dover Congregational Church came up with an idea to help our members be more prepared for such an event. Thus, Financial Seminars were established. One of our church members was a financial services professional who agreed to help us understand financial planning for the future. He presented his thoughts on how to be “Money Wise”, including budgeting, why to plan financially, the first important steps and how to begin. In addition, he discussed how to protect one’s income, retirement and other topics. Scott then arranged for a local attorney to share his knowledge about wills and trusts. A second session with the attorney is scheduled for March.

We hope that this information will prove to be helpful to our members.

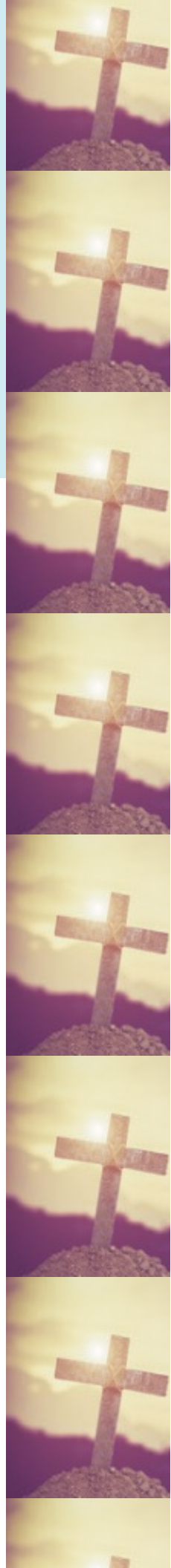

### Justice Witness Ministries is Back!

Your conference has a robust group of social justice-minded folks working together on several issues. Here's an update on our activities:

#### Justice "Road Show"

We're putting together a 90-minute workshop to share current activities and brainstorm ideas around racial, reproductive, and environmental justice, global mission, and gun safety. This workshop will involve videos, discussion, and hands-on activities to get folks excited about our UCC witness to justice in the world!
