Message from the Conference

Dear Friends,

The 2019 Annual Meeting of the Vermont Conference marked the last time an Annual Meeting took place in-person before the pandemic hit. That Annual Meeting also marked the first time our then-newly-called Associate Conference Minister Paul Sangree could join us and get to meet all of you! Our guest presenter that year was Rob Voyle, who spoke to us about Appreciative Inquiry. He challenged us in a gentle way to see what it is that God is calling us to do, either on our own or as part of a group.

At that time, none of us could have imagined what God would be calling us to do in the years that

followed! But in the midst of the global tragedy resulting from COVID-19, some amazing things have happened. The movement of churches to find creative and new technological ways to stay connected and to care for one another has been inspiring. That isn't to say it hasn't been challenging--and it is certainly still an on-going process. But in the spirit of Appreciative Inquiry I am mindful of all that our folks have done to try to meet the needs of those in our communities during difficult times.

After that Annual Meeting back in 2019, Paul Sangree wrote that he was particularly moved by the following prayer, offered at the Friday night worship service, from "Gates of Remembrance":

"We cannot pray to You, O God, to banish war, for you have filled the world with paths to peace, if only we would take them. We cannot pray to You to end starvation for there is food enough for all, if only we would share it. We cannot merely pray for prejudice to cease, for we might see the good in all that lies before our eyes, if only we would use



them. We cannot merely pray 'Root out Despair', for the spark of hope already waits within the human heart, for us to fan it into flame. We must not ask of You, O God, to take the task that You have given us. We cannot shirk, we cannot flee away, avoiding obligation for ever. Therefore we pray, O God, for wisdom and will, for courage to do and to become, not only to look on with helpless yearning as though we had no strength."

As we gather again at Annual Meeting--whether in-person or online, may our hearts be filled with God's strength to see where God is calling us anew!





Justice Witness Ministries

Your conference has a robust group of social justice-minded folks working together on several issues. Here's an update on our activities:

Justice "Road Show"

We're putting together a 90-minute workshop to share current activities and brainstorm ideas around racial, reproductive, and environmental justice, global mission, and gun safety. This workshop will involve videos, discussion, and hands-on activities to get folks excited about our UCC witness to justice in the world!

Financial Seminars in West Dover!

If your church is anything like ours, you probably have a good number of folks over 55 which in some circles qualifies them as "seniors". After hearing some scary

stories of friends who experienced a loss of their spouse and had little or no knowledge

about their finances, the <u>Loose Knit Group (LKG)</u> of the West Dover Congregational Church came up with an idea to help our members be more prepared for such an event. Thus, Financial Seminars were established. One of our church members was a financial services professional who agreed to help us understand financial planning for the future. He presented his thoughts on how to be "Money Wise", including budgeting, why to plan financially, the first important steps and how to begin. In addition, he discussed how to protect one's income, retirement and other topics. Scott then arranged for a local attorney to share his knowledge about wills and trusts. A second session with the attorney is scheduled for March. We hope that this information will prove to be helpful to our members.
