Message from the Conference

Vermont Conference friends,

Our Vermont Conference experienced a holy moment last Tuesday. It all started with a message the previous week from Elisa Lucozzi, our pastor in Guilford, to Elliott Munn, our pastor in Vergennes, alerting him that an anti-trans author was going to be speaking at his local high school. When Elliott got in touch with the school, he learned that the staff of the school were horrified, but that the rules of the school allowed for it. He then reached out to Caryne Eskridge, our pastor in Weybridge, who helped put him in touch with gueer organizations that were planning a rally at the high school and march to the town green focused on joy in response to this speaker. Elliott invited these organizations to his church that Sunday to share what they were doing. In addition to Elisa and Caryne, Elliott also received valuable advice from his wife and our Associate pastor in Middlebury, Elizabeth Gleich. Debbie Ingram, Executive Director of Vermont Interfaith Action and head of our Justice and Witness Team was also very helpful.

In consultation with church leaders, Elliott decided that the church should have a prayer service before the event at the high school, and invited both local clergy and church members and with the help of Elise in the Conference office, pastors from across the Conference. Our Conference Minister, Lynn Bujnak came, along with many other clergy from across the area and Conference and many people from the church in Vergennes-a total of 73! They then joined the group meeting outside of the high school, and the march that then went to

the town green.

Several of the pastors I spoke to who participated described this march as a holy moment. There was such joy on so many faces, and many of the 4-500 people who participated in the march came up to our clergy and told them how much it meant to them that they were there! (It helped that several of our pastors were wearing t-shirts that said "This Pastor Loves You!") The rally and march were all about supporting the kids, and many of the local kids from the school spoke on the green about how deeply they appreciated it. All in all, it was quite a night! We can be grateful that we all belong together to a Conference that followed the leading of the Spirit at such a time as this.

On a different topic, please be in prayer this week with your Vermont delegation as we travel to General Synod in Indianapolis! We will certainly report back to everyone about what we saw and experienced. May the Spirit be at work among us as well,









Clergy Convocation 2023 is coming Oct. 2-4th!

Environmental News from Professor Fred!



This recent webinar sponsored by the national UCC Office of Climate Justice was very informative about how people of faith can get involved in the EPA's process of strengthening their protections. You can watch a recording with this link on YouTube.

Description: Pollution from the power sector places a disproportionate burden on low income neighborhoods and communities of color. The power sector also produces a quarter of greenhouse gas emissions in the United States. In the coming months, there is a significant opportunity to advance environmental justice and put the United States on a path to achieve 100 percent carbon-free electricity by 2035. **In 2023, the Environmental Protection Agency can make desperately needed strides in strengthening protections that will safeguard communities and our future.** In this webinar, we will learn more about the possibilities before us and what communities of faith can do to realize them. Our featured panelists will be Charles Harper from Evergreen Action, Madison Mayhew from Interfaith Power & Light, and Michael Hansen from G.A.S.P.

Justice Witness Ministries

Your conference has a robust group of social justice-minded folks working together on several issues. Here's an update on our activities:

Justice "Road Show"

We're putting together a 90-minute workshop to share current activities and brainstorm ideas around racial, reproductive, and environmental justice, global mission, and gun safety. This workshop will involve videos, discussion, and hands-on activities to get folks excited about our UCC witness to justice in the world!

Racial Justice

Our VTCUCC Task Force is sponsoring two workshops in which church choirs and community choruses can learn spiritual music by black composers, to honor them and give them the recognition these composers deserve and have been unfairly denied for decades. Financial Seminars in West Dover!

If your church is anything like ours, you probably have a good number of folks over 55 which in some circles qualifies them as "seniors". After hearing some scary

stories of friends who experienced a loss of their spouse and had little or no knowledge about their finances, the *Loose Knit Group (LKG)* of the West Dover Congregational Church came up with an idea to help our members be more prepared for such an event. Thus, Financial Seminars were established. One of our church members was a financial services professional who agreed to help us understand financial planning for the future. He presented his thoughts on how to be "Money Wise", including budgeting, why to plan financially, the first important steps and how to begin. In addition, he discussed how to protect one's income, retirement and other topics. Scott then arranged for a local attorney to share his knowledge about wills and trusts. A second session with the attorney is scheduled for March. We hope that this information will prove to be helpful to our members.


Not-Your-Average Boundaries Training


