My mother-in-law, Astreed Tourian, died two years ago. Her family fled from the Armenian genocide during WWI, and after living in a few other places, ended up in Jerusalem, where she grew up from 1933 to 1948. These were the years of the British Mandate, when Palestinians and Jews lived together uneasily under British rule. Astreed and her family lived in an apartment building just outside the Armenian quarter in the Old City of Jerusalem.

Especially in the years following WWII, which ended in 1945, Zionist groups committed acts of terror in what was then called Palestine in an effort to get the British to create a state of Israel. One of those acts was to plant a bomb in the King David Hotel in Jerusalem, which killed one of Astreed's best friends, along with many others. Then in 1948, when the fighting became more heated, the apartment building next to the one Astreed's family was living in was bombed. Astreed's family decided that they needed to get out, and left at midnight and drove to Beirut, taking whatever possessions they could with them. They thought they would return when the fighting died down, but they never were able to. They made a new life in Beirut, where they were considered stateless refugees, until 1957, when they were able to come to the USA.

Despite her years in the Middle East, Astreed did not know any more than anyone else what might bring peace to her troubled home. But I know she would have resonated with this





















beautiful poem/prayer, written by Rabbi Sheila Weinberg, that was shared with me by our own Tracy Weatherhogg:

Two Peoples, One Land
Three Faiths, One Root
One Sky, One Beginning, One Future, One Destiny
One Broken Heart, One God
We Pray to You
Grant us a Vision of Unity
May we see the Many in the One and the One in the Many
May You, Life of all the Worlds
Source of all Amazing Differences
Help us to See Clearly
Guide us Gently and Firmly toward each other Towards
Peace. Amen.



I'll never forget the magic of the giant bubble lights on the Christmas tree when I was young. Not the small, delicate ones with the colors you'd find in a crayon box, but the big, chunky bubble lights with electric colors in the bases and tubes, glowing over the branches and ornaments. Paired with the way the light would shimmer off of the tinsel that was draped over every bough, it created an atmosphere of peace that one would not expect from items made in the 70s and 80s. When you think about the miracle of Christmas, the light from the stars and angels that roused the shepherd, the cozy lantern glow inside the stable where Jesus was born, and the unearthly brightness of the star that the Wise Ones followed to find Jesus, it isn't so far removed to consider the peace that can come from such unlikely circumstances. Our Holy Moment for Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany is themed around LIGHT this year, because in a post pandemic life filled with unlikely circumstances, couldn't we all use a reminder of how LIGHT transforms everything?


