You probably know that this past Saturday night, three Palestinian college students on their way to dinner in Burlington were shot at close range. Since two of them were wearing the Palestinian kaffiyeh, a traditional Palestinian headdress, it seems clear that it was a hate crime, though the authorities are still investigating. The three had all been students together at the Ramallah Friends School in the West Bank, and now all are going to American universities.

What you may not know is that all three are connected to one of our Conference churches, the Charlotte Congregational Church, UCC. Pastors Susan Cooke Kittredge and Kevin Goldenbogen were on our Conference clergy call this Tuesday, sharing what they know about the incident. Both of them have been incredibly busy since the shooting, seeking to support the families and visiting the young men in the hospital, something that Pastor Hadley Abernathy from the Charlotte church has been joining them in. Susan and Kevin both spoke very candidly about the pain they and their congregation are going through as they seek to support these very traumatized students and their

families.

One of the things many of us in the UCC are most proud of is our record of speaking out against hate in its many different forms in Jesus' name. Once again, we as leaders of our churches have an opportunity to remind our congregations of what hate looks like, and what love looks like. The Vermont Conference UCC Justice and Witness Ministry urges all of us to become familiar with and make use of the content of the many UCC Resolutions that have been created over the past years. These resolutions, dealing with church governance and social justice issues, help us understand who we are as members of the UCC and act as guidance for our work within our Faith. The UCC



has three types of resolutions: Pronouncements, Proposals for Action, and Resolutions and other formal motions that address policy or moral issues. For example, in 2022 when the Vermont Conference supported the passage of VT Article 22, a declaration in the state constitution of the right to personal reproductive autonomy, we were able to refer to the long history of UCC action and statements supporting reproductive liberty: https://www.ucc.org/the-ucc-fight-for-reproductive-justice/. This past month, the UCC resolutions have offered solid guidance for the complex and volatile issue of the latest escalation of the conflict between Israel and Palestine. The 2021 General Synod, under the leadership of Rev. Elliott Munn of the Vergennes Congregational Church, passed a resolution "decrying the oppression of Palestinian people;" adding this resolution to similar statements crafted by the UCC over the past

many years: https://www.ucc.org/synod-delegates-approve-resolution-decrying-oppression-of-palestinian-people/ As we work together within our UCC congregations, with other secular and faith partners, these resolutions offer guidance and legitimacy to our work and act as a witness to others about our UCC mission.

MEMA Mass Care Disaster/Emergency Shelter Course Announcement from our VT Conference Disaster Response Coordinator, Rev. Greg Briggs!!

Maine's Emergency Management Agency is offering a number of training for Mass Care after a natural or human caused disaster. I encourage anyone that is considering this for your church or community to attend. This training will include information for setting up Emergency Shelters, including a section devoted to Warming and Cooling Shelters.

After our flooding last July, one of the challenges to providing urgent care was the limited spaces for displaced individuals, as well as adequate housing for incoming volunteer groups. I would like to see at least one additional church in each Association to become equipped to either be an emergency shelter, or a short term host site for volunteer groups. In 2017, a group of militants attacked Marawi City on the southern island of Mindanao, and Dansalan's Marawi campus suffered fire, vandalism, and hostage-taking. Most of the campus was destroyed. Today, Dansalan College concentrates on its Iligan campus, about 25 miles from Marawi City. The college is working to improve facilities so it can function as the main campus. The previously built conference center is now being used for classes and administration of the school. Currently, the college is constructing an academic building. They plan to build several athletic facilities, faculty residences, and a new library building.


