Dear Beloved Community in the Vermont Conference,

When I worked for the national setting of the UCC, I had responsibility in the area of ministerial vocation and formation. I worked with seminarians and with seminaries and other theological training programs. It was rewarding work and I learned a great deal about the diversity of needs for ministerial leaders, especially as I worked with the theological education program in Hawaii and the one begun by the Council of American Indian Ministries. The way a pastoral leader is recognized and what training and education is needed for the unique ways churches in a variety of settings and cultures are church together expanded my own

understanding and approach to ministry.

One project I coordinated was raising awareness in our congregations to look for those who may be gifted and called to be pastors. "Ask the Question" was simply that - identifying persons who exhibit the qualities needed in pastors and speaking up! Ask them if they have thought about being called to be a pastor and tell them what you see in them.

In these days when many of our churches are no longer able to maintain a full or even part-time pastor coupled with less people going to seminary and pastors who are retiring or shifting out of pastoral ministry, it has become a crucial time for all of us to "Ask the Question." By September, the joint program we will be sharing with the New Hampshire Conference called the Ministry Preparation Program will launch. This program is designed to meet several needs for church leadership. There will be education and preparation for licensed pastors for our small churches, training for lay leaders in those churches and opportunities to keep building skills and knowledge through ongoing education and seminars. 


UCC Webinar—Black History: Unsung Heroes of the Environmental Justice Movement

Michelle Fountain is a journalist, teacher, student and preacher. In a previous life, she was the Public Affairs Manager for the Pennsylvania Region for State Farm Insurance where she was in charge of media, community and political outreach, as well as employee publications. She worked as a journalist writing primarily for *The Vermont Standard* for close to 15 years and occasionally still dabbles in journalistic writing. Michelle taught English at Woodstock Union High School for 16 years and now teaches English at Proctor High School.



She holds a Masters Degree in Education from Plymouth State and has taken courses at the Middlebury Bread Loaf School of English in African American Rhetoric and How to be an Antiracist Teacher. She has led teachers in looking at their privilege by working through Layla Saad's *Me and White Supremacy*. Michelle is also the licensed minister at the United Church of Ludlow. She developed "Unpacking Privilege" as a workshop for attendees at the annual meeting for the Vermont Conference of the United Church of Christ in April, 2022.



Each church will be asked to bring a team of a Pastor and at least 3 lay people. Each of the above topics will be overviewed, and then each church will choose the two areas they wish to address first. Churches will be clustered in cohorts around these topics for a year of training and coaching. In my experience, the year of coaching helps a church to put the principles of a seminar into practice.

The Hope Fund is funding special scholarships for Vermont Conference churches to participate. We ask for \$100 for your church to come to the seminar (lunch included for all your participants) and \$250 for a year of coaching for your church.





The Vermont Conference UCC Justice and Witness Ministry urges all of us to become familiar with and make use of the content of the many UCC Resolutions that have been created over the past years. These resolutions, dealing with church governance and social justice issues, help us understand who we are as members of the UCC and act as guidance for our work within our Faith. The UCC



has three types of resolutions: Pronouncements, Proposals for Action, and Resolutions and other formal motions that address policy or moral issues. For example, in 2022 when the Vermont Conference supported the passage of VT Article 22, a declaration in the state constitution of the right to personal reproductive autonomy, we were able to refer to the long history of UCC action and statements supporting reproductive liberty: https://www.ucc.org/the-ucc-fight-for-reproductive-justice/. This past month, the UCC resolutions have offered solid guidance for the complex and volatile issue of the latest escalation of the conflict between Israel and Palestine. The 2021 General Synod, under the leadership of Rev. Elliott Munn of the Vergennes Congregational Church, passed a resolution "decrying the oppression of Palestinian people;" adding this resolution to similar statements crafted by the UCC over the past

many years: https://www.ucc.org/synod-delegates-approve-resolution-decrying-oppression-of-palestinian-people/ As we work together within our UCC congregations, with other secular and faith partners, these resolutions offer guidance and legitimacy to our work and act as a witness to others about our UCC mission.
