Dear friends,

We start a new year together this week, and I hope that your 2024 is full of possibilities!

One special Conference vitality event coming up this year is going to be with Paul Nickerson, a UCC minister who has served local churches, worked on Conference staff and for the past 15 years has been a full time consultant and coach to churches across the country, working with all the mainline denominations. Paul has successfully worked with a number of churches in the Vermont Conference, and he will be joining us on Saturday, March 9th from 930-3 at the Federated Church of Williston for the seminar:

"How to Help Your Church Grow!" The topics he will go over include:

- 1. Clarifying your sense of Purpose and Vision
- 2. How to understand the Community and your Church
- 3. How to reach new people in the unchurched and de-churched population
- 4. How to develop a discipleship program that helps people grow in faith
- 5. How to fund the future of our churches.
- 6. How online ministry impacts all the above topics
- 7. What very small congregations are looking at for future options Each church will be asked to bring a team of a Pastor and at least 3 lay people. Each of the above topics will be overviewed, and then each church will choose the two areas they wish to address first. Churches will be clustered in cohorts around these topics for a year of training and coaching. In my experience, the year of coaching helps a church to put the principles of a seminar into practice.

The Hope Fund is funding special scholarships for Vermont

Conference churches to participate. We ask for \$100 for your church to come to the seminar (lunch included for all your participants) and \$250 for a year of coaching for your church. The first 10 churches that sign up will be eligible for this price. You can register below!



UCC Webinar— Primary Season: Prioritizing Climate Solutions

Recent headlines have highlighted a "waning

enthusiasm" among voters who have helped propel environmental justice champions into office in previous elections. A decline in enthusiasm has been noted among Black, Hispanic, and young voters. Among voters concerned about the climate crisis, dissatisfaction and anger have arisen as fossil fuel projects in Alaska and Appalachia move forward. In this webinar, we will focus on what can be done to create the momentum needed for champions of climate justice to be elected into office. We will look at how climate solutions can be prioritized in the primaries, so that policies in accord with environmental justice values can be advanced. Our featured webinar guests include speakers from the League of Conservation Voters, the Black Voters Matter

Fund, and the Green New Deal Network. Even if you cannot make the webinar at its scheduled time on January 10th at 1 pm ET, still sign-up, and we will send you a link to a recording of it. Register now!



The Hope Fund in Action!!!

On Sunday 12/3 at 4PM, Charlotte
Congregational Church (an open and
affirming congregation of the United
Church of Christ) hosted our 10th annual
Messiah Sing. Together, 12 professional
musicians and 170 chorus singers




combined to fill our sanctuary with joyful noises and hallelujahs. It all felt like a giant gift, light in the darkness, sonic grace.

Though this was our 10th annual Messiah Sing, it was the first time since 2018 that we held it with a full contingent of musicians as a separate event outside of a Sunday morning worship service. That programmatic change, combined with a robust marketing effort, filled our sanctuary with a majority of attendees who had little or no connection to our church. That change also significantly raised the cost of the event. We are grateful to the Hope Fund of the Vermont Conference, United Church of Christ that provided a grant to make this event possible. These funds supplemented attendee donations and church funds to help us engage our wider community through the arts. Which is not just fun, not just a nice thing to do, but it's part of our core mission: "Embraced by the healing love of Jesus Christ and inspired by his teachings, we commit ourselves to prayerful, compassionate, and courageous action in the world."

Thank you to the people of the Vermont Conference for your vision and generosity through the Hope Fund to help your mission partners in Charlotte be the church that God in Christ is calling us to be.

The Vermont Conference UCC Justice and Witness Ministry urges all of us to become familiar with and make use of the content of the many UCC Resolutions that have been created over the past years. These resolutions, dealing with church governance and social justice issues, help us understand who we are as members of the UCC and act as guidance for our work within our Faith. The UCC



has three types of resolutions: Pronouncements, Proposals for Action, and Resolutions and other formal motions that address policy or moral issues. For example, in 2022 when the Vermont Conference supported the passage of VT Article 22, a declaration in the state constitution of the right to personal reproductive autonomy, we were able to refer to the long history of UCC action and statements supporting reproductive liberty: https://www.ucc.org/the- ucc-fight-for-reproductive-justice/. This past month, the UCC resolutions have offered solid guidance for the complex and volatile issue of the latest escalation of the conflict between Israel and Palestine. The 2021 General Synod, under the leadership of Rev. Elliott Munn of the Vergennes Congregational Church, passed a resolution "decrying the oppression of Palestinian people;" adding this resolution to similar statements crafted by the UCC over the past many years: https://www.ucc.org/synod-delegates-approveresolution-decrying-oppression-of-palestinian-people/ As we work together within our UCC congregations, with other secular and faith partners, these resolutions offer guidance and legitimacy to our work and act as a witness to others about our UCC mission.
